## Notes to item 2 – Election of Directors

There are three candidates seeking election to the Board and three vacancies. The Board supports the election of Murray Jordan and Dr Martin Misur whose nominations follow Board succession planning, and a publicly-advertised search process, to fill vacancies arising from two retirements at the 2019 AGM. The Board also supports the re-election of Julia Raue based on her skills, experience and contribution to the Society since her original election to the Board in 2015.

## 2.1 To elect Murray Jordan as a Director

Murray Jordan is a former Managing Director of Foodstuffs North Island – one of New Zealand's largest businesses - and an experienced company director.
