

Eligibility criteria for bilateral breast reduction allowance

Southern Cross will only reimburse the allowance for a bilateral breast reduction under a member's policy on acceptance of a medical report supplied by the operating surgeon that demonstrates criteria **1**, **2**, **3**, **4** and **5** below are met for that member.

- 1. At least **two** of the following symptoms have been present for a minimum of 12 months:
 - pain in the upper back, neck or shoulders
 - headaches (secondary to neck or back pain)
 - pain / discomfort / ulceration from bra straps cutting into shoulders (not just imprints of straps)
 - associated skin disorders unresponsive to conservative medical treatment.
- 2. Medical examination confirms macromastia.
- **3.** Bra cup size is over DD.
- **4.** The amount of breast tissue to be removed is estimated to be at least 350 grams per breast.
- **5.** If the patient is over 30 years, there were no suspicious lesions found on a mammogram completed within 12 months of the date of surgery.

The allowance for a bilateral breast reduction will **not** be reimbursed in the following circumstance:

for breast reduction via tumescent liposuction.

Notes

- The allowance is a one-off payment.
- There is no further benefit or allowance payable for any subsequent treatment that may be required either for complications relating to the breast reduction surgery or dissatisfaction with the results.
